

2022 Music Teacher of the Year General Information

In recognition of the fact that elementary music teachers make an important and positive difference in young people's lives, the Dallas Symphony will be honoring these teachers and the impactful work they do by presenting a Music Teacher of the Year Award.

Submitting an application is more than a chance to win an award. Each teacher that invests time into this process also strengthens the DSO's voice in advocating for music education in North Texas. We appreciate your support and dedication in this regard.

Who is eligible?

Current, full-time elementary music teachers in Dallas ISD, with a tenure of at least 3 years. Former winners are not eligible to apply.

If chosen as a finalist, nominee will be invited to attend a DSO concert in March for the award ceremony, pending safety conditions due to Covid-19; date tbd. Complimentary tickets will be provided for finalists (friends & family will be offered substantial discounts).

Who can nominate?

Anyone with first-hand knowledge of the teacher and his or her work may nominate. Self-nominations are highly encouraged and will be accepted.

Judging Criteria:

- A successful track record of measurable program growth
- Demonstrated student achievement in instrumental or vocal performance
- Strong cultural leadership and influence in the community

Awards

Finalists: All finalists will receive two free tickets to the concert in March, recognition from the stage before the concert, a finalist's certificate, and a collection of valuable items from the Williamson Music Company.

Winner: The Music Teacher of the Year will be invited onto the Meyerson stage to be honored before the concert in March and will receive a check for \$500. They will also receive an engraved plaque from the Dallas Symphony, to be presented to them at the concert.

If the in-person award recognition is cancelled due to Covid-19, finalists will receive recognition in another way TBD and will still receive prize money.

All applications and supporting materials must be submitted by January 28th, 2022. Please submit applications and all supporting materials as attachments to a single email to s.hatler@dalsym.com, with the subject line "MTOY 2022."

Five finalists will be announced on February 4th, 2022. The winner will be notified on March 1st, 2022.
